I've been thinking... "Thoughts constitute the greatness of man" (Pascal.The Pensees.) He explains it this way: "I wish to show you an infinite and indivisible thing. It is a point moving everywhere with an infinite velocity; for it is one in all places, and is all totality in every place. Our minds can consider such possibilities, even apparently impossible ones because we can think."

Genesis 1 tells us "In the beginning...God said let there be light." This means that divine thought and consciousness came before even the event of light. The Gospel of John starts in the same way: "In the beginning was the Logos (word)." The Logos is consciousness and information pure and simple. John is very clear about the importance of God' consciousness/awareness. The Logos is not only prior to everything that is made, but is also personal, "All things come into being through Him." Teilhard de Chardin calls this the "tenacious personalism" of divine awareness at the omega point of everything. This alive and personal word is the first definition of God in John 1. "The Word was with God, and the Word was God...the Word became flesh and dwelt among us...full of grace and truth." Matthew and Luke join with John and tell with ordinary event narrative how this happened on an actual day in human history; the eternal speech of God was born into a family at Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the King.

Jesus in his Sermon on the Mount makes the consciousness of God a major theme. He invites his followers to pray to God in the privacy of their room. The teacher Jesus makes it clear that we need to know two things: God can see us and God can hear us (Matthew 6:5-8). In that quiet room of prayer two kinds of consciousness are put together, God's awareness and our awareness. One of the reasons I believe in God is this reality of consciousness.

There is an argument from analogy here. We are able to think, to remember, and to imagine because God exists. God gives to us our eyes for seeing, ears so that we hear, mouths so that we can speak, and our minds so that we may wonder. The one who created these possibilities is also able to see and hear; he is also able to speak for himself. This happened when the Word became flesh. Pascal writes: "It is incomprehensible that God should exist and it is incomprehensible that he should not exist...all these contradictions; which seem most to keep me from the knowledge of the Christian belief have led me most quickly to the true one."

It is the true one who finds us. This finding happens because God's awareness is not passive but is compassionate. God's consciousness is not stranded as idea or imaginative awareness but is concrete and totally personal in the mixture of who Jesus Christ is and what he does. Jesus is the Redeemer who finds us.

I like the whimsical way that Pascal tells it: "An artisan may speak of wealth, a lawyer may speak of war, or of royalty, etc. But it is a rich man who may rightly speak of wealth, a king may speak indifferently of a great gift he has just made, and God rightly speaks of God."

Consciousness may be the newest frontier in the dialogue between science and faith, even where quantum physics and Logos may occupy the same sentence. Consciousness means that we listen, look, and speak, and because of our awareness we should not be surprised that Ultimate Consciousness is able to listen, hear, and speak too.

Earl Palmer Ministries is pleased to present this seminar - **The Joy of Teaching through Exposition of the Bible** - a one day event/series of sessions for pastors and lay teachers to join together with a threefold purpose:

- to hear the case/examine the importance/value of exposition;
- to learn the methods/steps of/for preparation of exposition in the worship/teaching setting:
- to learn ways to communicate and affirm the Gospel through exposition.

What exactly does "Exposition of the Bible" mean?

To understand the Bible we begin by first listening to the Biblical text. Then we move forward by asking simple questions that go from "What is the writer/speaker/narrator in the text saying?" to include "What do the words of the writer/speaker/narrator in the text/context mean?" When the preacher/teacher shares this journey of understanding with the listeners we call this exposition. The goal of exposition is to present the text of the Bible in such a way that the listener- including the teacher/preacher- discovers for himself/herself a personal connection to the message of the text.

The Resource Teacher for this event is Earl Palmer who will present the case for exposition and then teach through example in studies of separate New Testament texts. In addition there will be a designated responder for each presentation who will offer a reflection after each of three sessions. Time will be arranged also for Q and A with the large group.

There is a lovely amalgamation that happens when he is teaching, so that difficult concepts and the "offense" of the gospel become attractive and compelling. Also, in my personal journey at this time, I have been greatly reassured by the teaching that "we who live now in the present dynamic, turbulent age, work hard not in fear or boredom but in hope. Not because night is coming and daylight is closing down, but because the day is coming..." (Palmer, 1975, Salvation by Surprise, p. 107)

Conference in Taiwan Features Expository Preaching

Through the years, Dr. Paul Shen (1917-2011) has been a legend among pastors. He may be best remembered for his unwavering and devoted commitment to expository preaching. Shen had one driving mission in his last 4 decades: to pass on his love for expository preaching to the next generation of Chinese Ministers. For that mission, he wrote the book -'Dr. Paul Shen Shares His 65 Years of Expository Preaching Ministry'-and its sequel, together with a number of books on expositions from NT texts; for that mission, he initiated a series of Expository Preaching Conferences on the east and west coast of the United States as well as in cities across Asia. He also taught the subject in several seminaries; and the love of that mission continued to the final days of his life. To honor the legacy of Dr. Shen, the first Paul Shen Lectureship has been designed to perpetuate the mission of God's Servant to pass on his mission of expository preaching and will be held on March 9-13, 2015 at Holy Light Seminary in Kaohsiung, Taiwan.

Earl Palmer has been invited to be the plenary speaker for this conference, and EPM has made it possible for me to attend with him. I look forward to this experience as a great opportunity to grow from the inspiration of Dr. Shen and learn about the intricacies of expositional preaching while gaining a deeper understanding of the Chinese culture and Christianity. It is an honor for Earl and me to be present at this exceptional gathering of pastors whose work in Christian ministry extends across the world. We look forward to being a part of this fellowship.
