Dear Friends of Earl Palmer Ministries,

This is the Season of Lent. As believers in Christ we move into a time of repentance with people worldwide. This is a period of intentional discipline in our lives to rethink how we live and refocus on the meaning of Jesus' life and death through the reading of scripture, prayers of confession, reverence of worship and acts of discipleship.
